1 <u>Welcome</u>

Cressida Coates welcomed all the attendees and she was glad to see everyone in person. Before proceeding further she asked Ian Balgowan to provide an update on Jim Bruce's health. Ian explained that despite already have received two vaccinations Jim Bruce had been admitted to ARI to a severe case of covid-19. Jim has been receiving oxygen on a long term basis but is beginning to improve; it is thought that Jim will be in hospital for a good few days as he gets very tired. Otherwise Jim is bored with his enforced inactivity so he is definitely on the road to recovery.

2 Previous AGM minutes.

The minutes of the last AGM held on 23rd March 2021 were circulated immediately after the meeting and were approved by those attending by 30th April 2021.

3 Chair's Report (Cressida Coates).

Sadly, given the restrictions which are still in place we are unable to provide refreshments at this AGM – perhaps we can make up for this lack at the next AGM!

As you all know it is customary for the Chair to provide a summary on what has occurred throughout previous year, however as we had our 2020 AGM earlier this year, this report you will glad to learn will be brief as we only have six months to report on.

In line with Scottish Government Guidelines, we managed to open the Tolbooth, albeit Saturday and Sundays only, from the beginning of May 2021 but at least it was a positive step towards some form of normality.

The Tolbooth was given a good clean in readiness for opening day. Our visitor numbers were good, and it was hoped that visitors would come back and see us.

We maintained the weekend opening through to the end of June to allow us to measure the demand for the museum.

As COVID restrictions were being eased we decided to open longer at weekends adding a Friday and Monday to the mix and this has generally worked well throughout the months of July, August and September although there were few occasions we had to close.

As you all know we are now in our winter season and have reverted to weekend openings with winter times of 12.30 p.m. and 3.30 p.m.

During this time, we have welcomed quite a few more volunteers to the wearing of that special 'red fleece' and we hope they will indeed enjoy their time as a volunteer.

During the last six months we have continued work behind the scenes with some improvements to the Museum. There is new shelving in the North Room which houses some exhibits. A large number of photographs have been re-imaged, and some are placed on new display boards to provide a fresher look and will be revamped periodically.

There is also a new front door and I think we can all agree it is certainly an improvement on the old one.

As we were/are still within certain restrictions it was felt that we should utilise the 'Courtyard' to hold outside events if visitors were nervous about coming inside. But the 'Courtyard' even now has been a bit of a bone of contention, and we all know sadly that in plain terms what that meant was it was a disgrace. These issues were not new and have been going on for years but in light of wanting to hold events in the 'courtyard' more action had to be taken. Improvements have been made but we will need to keep on top of this to stop it happening again.

At this point I would like to my appreciation to all those involved that made these events happen. To the trustees Clare, Liz and Mary who gave extra time and energy to make these events happen. To the folk that came along and offered their services. To the enthusiastic support of volunteers and friends as these events proved very popular in those summer months and kept visitors to the town entertain.

To our Social media gurus who have kept the Tolbooth Museum current.

The *Stanehyve* publication has continued throughout, and thanks go to Gordon and Liz for all their hard work. This publication has received some very favourable comments over the year.

Our new Shop Co-ordinator has been managing the shop and all appears to be working well.

It is with regret however that our Curator Louise Coates has stepped down from her role (although she has kindly offered to provide any assistance from afar) to pursue her academic career and we all wish her all the best and thank her for all her hard work in the role of Curator.

So how do we (Trustees and Volunteers alike) see the future of the Tolbooth Museum?

4 <u>Treasurer's Report (Dennis Collie)</u>

The financial report covers the year ending March 2021 and was hugely different from the previous financial year.

Due to Covid restrictions, the museum was open on only 14 days, with 467 visitors for the whole year. That compares with the previous year's figures of 223 days open bringing in a total 27,592 visitors.

Hopefully the handout (attached as Appendix 1) is easily understood and I include some explanatory notes.

Under Income

The figure for Awards, Sponsors etc. is explained under note 1 at the bottom of the appendix. The significant gross sales figure is almost entirely due to the sales of the *Stonehaven Shops* booklet, and all those involved in the production and sale of the booklet are to be highly commended for their efforts.

The figure under eCard is what is taken via the hand-held card reader, and it is really difficult to separate sales from donations so I just record it all as sales.

Under Expenditure

The £886 under Admin is almost entirely the PPE materials (wipes, sanitisers, stands etc.) and was covered by the first MGS grant.

Display materials are covered by another grant

Stock for sales was mainly the printing of the Stonehaven Shops booklet.

The final balance includes £41.80 carried forward from the previous year and reserved for the Fireballs organisation.

Douglas Cusine pointed out an arithmetic error (now corrected) and as there were no further questions or comments from the floor Dennis thanked all those involved in the museum operation.

5 Election of new Trustees

The constitution states that a third of the Trustees have to stand down at each AGM; on this occasion Ian Balgowan, Jim Bruce, Gordon Ritchie and Mary Sutcliffe, who had all been elected on 2017, stood down. However, all four offered themselves up for re-election and as there were no other nominees Cressida Coates proposed that they were all re-elected. The attendees unanimously seconded the motion. Dennis Collie had intimated at the previous AGM that he would be standing down at this AGM but other claims on his time had reduced consequently he was now happy to serve for another year.
